### Improve your wellbeing by developing your resilience

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There is much research to support the belief that people who feel like they have a level of control over a situation are more likely to feel calmer and more content when things do not go how they wish. Knowing the different choices that we have and accepting the ones we do not, can reassure people that the situation is not hopeless. We hope you found this series on resilience useful and feel more equipped to support both children and adults with developing their resilience so that they can thrive.

Control: Children who feel like they can control an outcome, feel more positive about being able to overcome adversity.

You can empower a child by:

- Helping children to understand that life's events are not random, but usually the result of an individual's choices and actions, either their own or another person's. Talk through the steps that led up to a positive or negative experience to help them identify which choices helped them and which did not. Where another individual is involved, encourage them to problem solve to identify what steps they could take so that they feel confident and competent.
- Understanding that discipline is about teaching, not punishing or controlling. Encourage self-discipline and point out how their actions produce certain consequences, either positive or negative. Use praise to help build confidence and encourage positive choices. Taking time to point out successes and what a child is doing well and looking at other people for what they can do better will help develop their competence too.

Next year we will be looking at mindfulness techniques for becoming calm and reflective as well as exploring the ts the 5 steps for well-being (Connect. Be active. Take notice. Keep learning and Give) in more detail.

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## Spotlight on Excellence this week is: Celebrating musical talent

This week we held our annual evening of musical celebration for all of the pupils in school who play a musical instrument. Our audience of parents, family, friends and teachers were treated to over an hour of fantastic performances by the pupils, all of whom have lessons on their instruments here at school.

There were performances both solo, duets and in groups by pupils on guitar, flute, clarinet, keyboards and drums. Pupils have been playing for differing lengths of time, some only a few weeks, compared to some of our year 6 children who were playing in their last concert but have been playing for several years.



We never cease to be amazed by the talents of the children at Birchwood, and are always impressed by the dedication of the children (and parents) to the practise and time it takes to learn an instrument. Well done to all who performed, you were all stars.

## Warwickshire & Northamptonshire Air Ambulance. Let us keep this service flying.



### Procedures following a child's absence

Following a child's absence please follow the below procedures:

- A telephone call should be made to school before 8.30am giving the reasons why your child is absent.
- If no contact has been received, a text message will be sent to the first contact on the child's records asking why the child is absent.
- If we do not receive a response to the text message, a member of the office staff will telephone the child's contact numbers to establish why he/she is not in school.
- An absence note should always be sent into school upon the child's return. This should include the child's name, class, dates of absence and reason for absence.

It would be beneficial for you to provide one of the following (wherever possible) which may enable the Headteacher to authorise your child's absence:

- Medical appointment card
- Sight of Medication prescribed by a GP
- Copy of prescription
- Letters concerning hospital/dental appointments.


