Testing School Staff

Many people with coronavirus (COVID 19) have mild, or even no symptoms, but can still spread the virus. With regular self-testing we can slow the spread and help protect the most vulnerable in our families and communities.

Testing is important because staff could be carrying the virus without knowing it and may spread it to others. Up to one in three people who have coronavirus do not display any symptoms. Testing all staff without symptoms will support schools and nurseries to continue to operate.

This week we have taken delivery of home testing kits, supplied to all Primary schools, to support our Primary school staff to take part in regular asymptomatic testing. Asymptomatic refers to people who are infected but never develop any symptoms. These simple and quick tests using antigen Lateral Flow Devices (LFD) enable the rapid testing of staff, from their home, without the need for a laboratory.

Staff will be asked to take their test kits home and carry out the test twice a week. The LFD test will give a result in around 30 minutes and staff will report their results to NHS Test and Trace as soon as the test is completed. Staff will also share their result with school to help us with contact tracing. Testing is not mandatory but staff will be strongly encouraged to participate.

It is vitally important that our systems of control continue to be rigorous to enable the safest possible environment for all. The testing programme is an important addition to supporting education through this pandemic and will help break the chains of transmission.

Testing in School But Not as We Know it!


<u>Spotlight this week is on...</u> Road Safety



As a school situated on a very busy road, the safety of children around traffic has been high on our agenda and indeed part of our curriculum in school for some time now. We work closely with the Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership, who come into school to work with children to teach them about road safety in both Key stage 1 and 2. We have Junior Road Safety Officers in school who work with children running competitions and sharing road safety messages throughout school. Drop off and collection times from school are always the busiest times on the roads near schools, and as Headteacher, Mr Coleman has long campaigned for improvements to the safety measures in place. The installation of the barriers and bollards, to ensure that cars do not park unsafely outside school as a result has helped, but parents can also help by ensuring that they remember to park considerately at all times when coming to the school site. Remember it is illegal to stop or park on the zig zag markings outside of the school. The safety of children is the number one priority of both school and parents alike, and by working together we can ensure this.
