Road safety

We are fully aware of how busy the roads and pavements are outside Birchwood and Polesworth School. Between both schools there are over 2000 students, plus their families, who complete the school run each day. Both Birchwood and The Polesworth School have limited access to their sites, causing a very busy and congested area outside of school. This is very concerning for all involved and we are all determined to do all we can to make the journey to and from school as safe as possible for everyone.

Over the last couple of weeks I have been in contact with the road safety team at Warwickshire County Council. I have asked for their help and support again with the concerns we have and they are reviewing potential options. I have repeatedly asked them to be proactive in replacing the school crossing patrol position they currently have vacant and have again asked them to review the option of a permanent pedestrian crossing between the two schools.

The Polesworth School have made some positive changes to their school reopening plan. They have introduced a limited stagger to the end of their school day and have organised for bus companies to stagger their pickup times. At Birchwood we will continue to run our staggered day and one way system on our school site. After half term we will also be pushing back our collection from school times at the end of the day to avoid the majority of the congestion caused by The Polesworth children on their journey home. More details will be communicated to parents regarding this before we break up for half term.





Road Safety Education!!

Continued.....We do however need 100% support from **ALL PARENTS AND VISITORS** to our schools. Despite our repeated requests in our weekly newsletter, on a daily basis we see parking and driving which places our children in danger.

We ask parents **NOT** to park on double yellow lines or on yellow zig zags outside the school. We also ask parents not to park on pavements, which force children to squeeze through narrow gaps, or worse still, walk into the road to get past. Unfortunately, on a regular basis, we also receive complaints from neighbours complaining about parents parking over their driveways, blaming the school and demanding we take action. The school however, has absolutely no jurisdiction over the public roads and can do very little.

In school we continue to work hard to teach our children to learn and recognise the importance of Road Safety. Miss Lowe is our Road Safety Champion and she works very closely with representatives from the Warwickshire Road Safety Club to deliver a full and comprehensive road safety curriculum across school. Our only interest is in keeping children safe, **PLEASE** help us to do so by driving carefully and parking responsibly. If driving is your only option, parking safely away from school and walking an extra 60 seconds, is worth it if it avoids a child being seriously injured. Please support us by doing your bit. Thank you.

Birchwood Best Practice

Mathematics

Mathematics at Birchwood follows a mastery approach, beginning with teaching children the conceptual understanding using a range of practical equipment which then allows them to approach their knowledge and skills with fluency, reasoning and problem solving.



Our school curriculum delivers mathematics discretely and also by linking directly to thematic learning. This is delivered through morning activities, discrete/thematic lessons and maths meetings (consolidating previous skills and knowledge) - this is supported through mental arithmetic tasks as part of our weekly home learning.

Children at Birchwood are positive and enthusiastic about their maths learning and are taught to link skills learnt with other areas of the curriculum including Science, Design Technology and Physical Education.

We see mathematics to be a creative, interconnected subject which is essential in helping us in everyday life. We make effective use of our Food Technology area and ensure that we make links to real-life experiences, such as using money, time and measures to complete tasks outside of the maths lesson. - Miss Purdy

School Crossing Patrol Vacancy

A vacancy will soon be advertised again for a School Crossing Patrol Operative outside of Birchwood School. Times, pay and other

details are still to be confirmed by North Warwickshire Borough Council, but the position will require morning and afternoon cover, at the busiest times of the school day. Usually shifts are around 30 minutes each. The position will be for Monday to Friday term time only (38 weeks per year spread across 12 monthly payments.) A uniform and full training


