Our Visions and Values

We believe that our children will only achieve in learning environments where relationships are strong. High quality relationships and mutual respect between children and all other members of the community results in learning which is exciting, yet disciplined, and where the highest expectations are the norm.

Birchwood staff share our values and vision. They understand their crucial role in the education of all of our children and how their own individual work has a direct influence on young peoples 'life chances'. They are also 'team players' who have a clear understanding of our school's wider priorities and work together to improve their own practice and the outcomes for all of our children.

School Attendance

We have very much appreciated the support of parents who have made good decisions about whether to keep children at school or not. Whilst we obviously do not wish children to struggle in school; coughs, colds and other ailments do not necessarily mean children need to be off school. We encourage children to 'soldier on', as we as adults would do.

In school we remain very proactive in helping children to remain healthy. Apart from regular purges on 'hand washing' and 'coughing into a tissue' etc. when there are significant levels of stomach bugs about, we put in place special hand cleaning gels and even change the colours of liquid soap in the children's toilets to encourage them to wash their hands. The effect is amazing! We also give certificates each term for great attendance and never being late for school. The children love these.

An issue that remains a real problem for us is over absence reporting. The vast majority of our parents understand the importance of telephoning the school before 8.30am and leaving a message to let us know children will not be in and the reason for absence. If parents do not do this it causes a lot of problems in school. Hours of office time is currently being wasted on less than a handful of parents who do not call in. meaning that office staff need to act urgently to find out why children are missing from school. We will then require a signed note confirming the reason for absence, on the first day your child returns to school.

To safeguard all of our children, if we do not hear from parents by the required time, we telephone to find out where a child is. We do this primarily to make sure a child has not left home and then not arrived at school.

Asthma Inhalers

If your child has been prescribed an asthma inhaler by a doctor they MUST have it IN school at all times, even if they have:



- 'Never used it'
- 'Only have it because they went through a • bad patch'
- 'Only get asthma in winter'
- 'Have grown out of it

For children who have been prescribed an asthma inhaler and do not have it in school, parents will be contacted immediately to bring one in. Asthma is far from a minor ailment and is in reality a killer when it all goes wrong.


