Eating and staying healthy at Birchwood

Schools have an important role to play in reinforcing positive messages about eating and staying healthy. We also have a responsibility to ensure that our curriculum gives children a solid body of knowledge about healthy living and the skill to pursue it. Children need to learn how our bodies work, why physical health is important and how to prepare food. They need to grow in competence in sport and physical pursuits so that being active is enjoyable for them as well as challenging.

For many years Birchwood have placed 'eating and staying healthy' firmly within our curriculum. Over the past three years we have been working very closely with the 'Food For Life Programme' and the 'Soil Association' to support the fantastic work we are doing to provide healthy school meals, great lunchtimes and food education that has a positive impact on both pupils and the wider community. On Tuesday 26th March, Mrs Webb and some of our Eco Councillors from last year, are heading to Benn Hall in Rugby to collect the 'Food For Life Silver Award'. This is a fantastic achievement for all involved.

Our whole school approach makes a positive contribution to pupil health, wellbeing and personal development. As part of our work on healthy eating we have developed our own school 'Kitchen Garden', enabling our children to plant, grow and prepare their own food. We also hold an annual 'Farmers Market' in the summer, to enable the children to sell their products and wares. With our new fantastic Food Technology room, we can now support large groups of children to cook and taste their own food. Every half term each class complete at least one food project as part of their thematic learning.

We also work very hard to make our dinner times count. Our catering team from 'Educaterers', led by Mrs Pardoe, do a fantastic job preparing and serving healthy meals. The relationship they have with all our children is brilliant. I always hear lots of 'please and thank you' and many smiles exchanged in return. In February, the Food Standards Agency again awarded the Birchwood Bistro and Educaterers, a food hygiene rating of 5 (very good). This is the highest standard you can achieve and the second time in succession that we have received this standard. We also promote 'Healthy Lunchboxes' in school and I would like to thank all of our families for supporting this and ensuring that our children get a healthy and balanced diet. Our Mid-Day Supervisors also play an essential role in encouraging children to 'play' and enjoy themselves during their dinner time.

Currently we have a total of 14 after school activities/clubs running in school. Many of these are physical activities, promoting children to stay active. But, we also have two clubs that link to eating healthy. On a Monday Mrs Webb and Mrs Wright – a parent volunteer, hold cooking classes for parents and their children in our Food Technology room. We also have 'Change Makers', an organisation from Rugby, who deliver to our families a family lifestyle programme encouraging people to make healthier choices through weekly nutrition and physical activity sessions.

We know the importance of promoting healthy eating and living to our children and will continue to look for new and innovative ways to promote this in and outside of school.


