New Reception Intake

The last half term of the school year is always a very busy one as schools have lots of end of year activities to undertake, but are also spending time preparing for the next school year in September. One of our end of year tasks is to organise a smooth transition for all children to move into their new year groups and classrooms and to make provisions to welcome in our new starter children into Reception.

This year we were really pleased to receive 120 applications for a Reception place at Birchwood for September 2021, with 80 of those applications as a first choice. With many other really good schools in our local area to choose from, we are very proud that so many parents see Birchwood as their choice of school for their children.

Unfortunately, we are only able to take 60 new children each year, 30 into Acorn and 30 into Chestnut class. This means that for some parents, they have had to take up the offer of a place in one of the other local schools. It does disappoint me that we are not able to take more children each year, but whilst local schools in the area still have capacity, the Local Authority will not consider expanding our school.

As you can imagine, our usual transition arrangements for our new children have again been affected by the current Covid 19 pandemic. Unfortunately, our school continues to have to work under restrictions and strict risk assessments and we are unable to hold our usual welcome meeting for parents or invite our new children into school for our 'story time' sessions. Instead we will be sharing weekly virtual story time sessions and we are hoping, that should restrictions in school be lifted, that we will be able to invite parents in for a start up meeting, whilst children get to spend an hour in class meeting their teachers and new friends.

The official transition day for Warwickshire Schools is Wednesday 7th July. On this day our Year 6 children will be spending the day learning remotely with their new secondary schools and the rest of our children will be moving into their new class with their new class teacher for the day. Watch this space for more information regarding new classes and teachers for the next year.

Spotlight this week is ...

Sun Safety

As we have finally had a few days of sunshine, and some lovely weather over half term, we are taking this opportunity to remind parents of how we keep our children safe in the sun at school.

We promote:

- -The teaching of sun safety lessons during PSHE.
- -Pupils wearing hats when outside.
- -Children regularly drinking water and staying hydrated.
- -Where possible, all doors and windows being opened to provide a through breeze and classroom blinds drawn.
- -PE lessons which are carefully planned to avoid sun exposure, unnecessary exertion and dehydration.
- -In extreme weather, outdoor PE lessons which last for no more than 30 minutes and children are then brought indoors and given time to rest and drink water.
- -Children with medical conditions such as asthma being monitored and supported appropriately.

How parents can help:

- -Provide children with sun hats (please remember to name them clearly!)
- -Apply sunscreen to your child before coming to school.
- Make sure your children bring their water bottles to school each day.

Let us hope that we continue to have more sunshine than showers from now until the end of term!

Birchwood Best Practice

Phonics

Phonics is seen as one of the many skills needed to become a successful reader and writer. At Birchwood we follow the Department for Education's 'Letters and Sounds' programme for the teaching and learning of



phonics. Alongside this, we use the 'Jolly Phonics' songs and actions to support the introduction of new phonemes (sounds).

Children will have a daily phonics session from Reception to Year 2 or until they are secure with Phase 6. We ensure these lessons are multi-sensory to ensure the children enjoy them, participate in them and secure the essential skills needed.

Oral blending and segmenting are taught first before they are applied to reading and writing. Children are then taught that phonemes are blended in order from left to right for reading. We also use sound buttons to show the different graphemes within words and robot arms to break up words into phonemes when writing.

Our children thoroughly enjoy the phonics teaching and learning they receive at Birchwood. This is reflected in their enthusiasm within lessons, their passion for reading and writing from a young age and also our excellent results in the governments Year 1 Phonics Screening Check. - Miss Lowe

The law is very strict about holidays in term time and the school has no choice! The school is inspected by OFSTED to make sure we follow the rules properly and the Warwickshire





Parents often think it is the school that make up the rules, this is wrong; the school must follow the rules laid down by others. We hate upsetting parents who we have a great relationship with, but we often feel at the sharp end of apparently being responsible for the law.

The school does not support children being off in term time to take a holiday.
