Year 6 Residential Trip to Manor Adventure in Shropshire

On Friday 7th June Year 6 children from Birchwood, Dordon and Wood End Primary Schools, all headed off on our annual Residential Trip to Manor Adventure in Shropshire. This is the fourth year in a row that our primary schools have joined together on our annual trip. 55 of our Year 6 children at Birchwood signed up for this year's trip and they were accompanied by Mrs Oz, Miss Mould, Mr Hammersley, Mr Smith and myself. We spent the morning at Telford Town Park, where we stopped off for a comfort break, had our picnic and explored the Town Park's Adventure playground. Whilst the weather was not very kind to us, the children all still enjoyed the activities on offer. Strangely there were no other visitors to the Park that morning, which might have had something to do with the heavy rain that was falling!

We then made the short journey to Craven Arms in Shropshire to Culmington Manor. Here the children spent the next 4 days taking part in 14 different activities including climbing, abseiling, canoeing, kayaking, archery, obstacle course and underground maze. The children developed their confidence, communication and team work during the activities and got to experience many new things.

The weather continued to be a mixed bag, but we certainly did not let that dampen our spirits. We were very fortunate that the sun came out long enough for each group to enjoy the canoeing and kayaking down on the lake. After 3 very late nights, a few muddy puddles and some fantastic experiences, 100 children and 10 very tired members of staff arrived back at Birchwood and Dordon on the Monday afternoon.

A great time was had by all. The children mixed extremely well together across the 3 schools and formed lots of new friendships. They were perfectly behaved and the instructors at the centre were full of praise for our children's resilience, determination and manners throughout the weekend.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff and volunteers for giving up their weekend to support our trip. The thanks received from parents and children, at the end of our trip, were very much appreciated by all.

Coming into school late... 'It doesn't matter if my child is late for school'

Not what the children would say! They absolutely hate being late. They arrive after all their friends are already sat down in school and enter a classroom of 30 others looking at them. At the start of the day teachers take registers, explain to the children what they will be doing for the day and all sorts of other important instructions about what will be happening around school. Apart from this, being late is NOT an authorised absence. Persistent lateness will often result in contact from Education Social Workers who inspect our registers and will prosecute for persistent cases.

Improve your wellbeing by developing your resilience

As promised in our previous newsletter, here is our first instalment of some practical ways that people can build their own and their child's resilience. This life skill will support an individual's ability to cope more successfully with difficulties they may experience at different times in their life. This week our focus is on building competence.

Competence: This is the feeling of knowing we can handle a situation.

Support the development of competence by:

- Helping children to identify their own strengths. This explicitly identifies the skills and tools a child already has at their disposal and helps them to feel equipped.
- Instead of trying to 'fix' the problem for your child and shield them from the difficulty, encourage them to make decisions which empower them and make them feel capable. This may include: adding the word 'yet' onto the statement, 'I can't do it' so that it implies an intension to try. Instead of discussing and listing all the barriers, list all the possible solutions / ideas and 'try them out'. Celebrate when a barrier has been overcome by problem solving.
- Identify strengths in others, but avoid comparisons that may make a child feel like they are not skilled enough to have a go. If a child feels like they do not possess a particular skill that they think would be useful to their situation, encourage them to proactively think / research ways to develop it.

Next week we will be looking at <u>Confidence</u> and how this is linked to competence but different. If you have any questions or would like more information on developing health and wellbeing, please do not hesitate to contact us either through class teachers or the main office.


