School is Closed?

We come to the end of our first full week of school closure and home learning. I do hope that all of our families are safe and well.

On Monday 5th January the Prime Minister announced that England would be entering its third lockdown and as part of these measures, schools would be closed until after February half term. Sitting writing this 10 days after the announcement, it certainly does not feel like our school has closed.

We are still open to children of key workers and vulnerable children. Under new guidance, the criteria for both of these groups has widened and we are currently supporting a third of our children (150 pupils) within school provision. Children have been placed into 6 lockdown bubbles (one for each year group, with a Y5/6 bubble for our older children). Each bubble has been allocated a small group of teaching staff to support children with their day to day learning in school.

This means that the other two thirds of our children (300 pupils) are being supported with their learning from home. Despite the large numbers of staff still required to be in school, we have tried to ensure that class teachers are able to support our children and parents by providing remote learning sessions. Each class receive 3 live sessions a day with their class teacher. The purpose of these sessions is to provide instructions and guidance to support follow up learning tasks that have been planned and shared. The class teachers will introduce resources, model activities and gage children's understanding. These live sessions are also shared with children who are being supported in school.

Outside of the live sessions, class teachers are busy planning learning and creating resources to share. They are communicating with parents and children, providing help and support where they can and they are assessing and feeding back to children about the learning that has been uploaded. Class teachers are also trying to spend some time during the week in school when they can, to check in on their children and teaching staff working in their lockdown bubble.

......and support during these challenging times.

Although this Spring term feels very different and we certainly have less of our children and families attending school currently, to say that our school is 'closed' is simply not the case! Take care all.
