Summer Holiday Project 2020 – Colour Wheels

The summer holidays are nearly upon us and I am sure you all have plans for places to go and people to see. I really hope that restrictions are lifted that enable you to enjoy spending time with family and friends.



Every year we run a summer holiday project that gives children the opportunity to spend some time preparing some learning to share with next year's class teacher. The summer holiday projects are always optional and this year the children can choose to do any number of the project ideas. Each different colour wheel the children complete will be worth 10 dojo points and children will have a chance to share these back at school. Our staff will also get involved and look to share their own colour wheels they create with their class.

Below are some examples of different types of colour wheels the children could create that use a range of skills:

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| <p>1. Nature Colour Wheel</p> <p>Collect items from nature that reflect the different colours within the wheel and attach them to the card.</p>  <p>https://mothenatured.com/printables/nature-color-wheel-printable/</p> | <p>2. Recycled Colour Wheel</p> <p>Collect a range of different items from around your home and recycle and reuse these to create a 3d wheel.</p>  |
|  <p>3. Collage Colour Wheel</p> <p>Using different paper, card, magazines and pictures, cut out small shapes and overlap them to fill the colour sections.</p> |  <p>4. Fabric Colour Wheel</p> <p>Cut and sew together triangles of fabric to create your colour wheel. You might need to ask a grown up to help you.</p> |

Please do not think that these are the only options. There are lots of ways you can create your own colour wheel and you can base it on any theme you like. Our children have brilliant imaginations and I really look forward to bringing some extra colour to our classrooms when we return in September.
