

Below are some examples of different types of colour wheels the children could create that use a range of skills:

1. Nature Colour Wheel

Collect items from nature that reflect the different colours within the wheel and attach them to the card.



Collect a range of different items from around your home and recycle and reuse these to create a 3d wheel.

4. Fabric Colour Wheel

Cut and sew together triangles of fabric to create your colour wheel. You might need to ask a grown up to help you.
