



Within Early years it is much more prevalent and children can be seen taking part in playtime activities without them even realising that they are cementing their learning. Our learning each week covers different topics within the national curriculum and we make sure that there are numerous fun activities that the children will want to access, which compliments their learning, so it becomes something more meaningful than just 'play'.

For example when learning the story of Jack & The Beanstalk, the children enjoyed many activities that enabled them to access many subject areas. Creating bean patterns (Maths), cutting, creating and labelling a flower (Handwriting, English, Phonics), building castles with bricks (Design / Maths), measuring the giants footprints (Maths), watching and retelling the story (English, Phonics, Maths-ordering) and so much more. – Mrs Mills
