Now Press Play - Transition

Monday

At Birchwood, we always strive to ensure that children have a smooth and successful transition period when moving from year 6 to year 7, preparing them for the next stage in their education. During these unprecedented times, it is of paramount importance for us to aid the transition process for our children – we have been working closely with the Polesworth School to provide virtual Q and A sessions, as well as supporting children with a sequence of lessons and discussions within the classroom.

This week, we were given the opportunity to take part in a new and innovative transition activity - in collaboration with Lanchester Primary School we were tasked by the owners at Now Press Play, an immersive educational resource that brings the curriculum to life using wireless headphones, to create a new transition experience which would help, reassure and support future year six children in their move to high school. This experience will allow others to be plunged into an immersive experience, while hearing and acting out the worries, concerns and fears of other children in their same position, before experiencing how these situations may be resolved.

We started by taking part in a Zoom conversation with Tilly from Now Press Play and the children from Lanchester School, in which we were given clear instructions for our task; this began with sharing our current fears and concerns about the transition to secondary school on Padlet, an online information sharing resource. Next, our children listened to the current Now Press Play transition experience, and critically evaluated it in order to make sure we were able to create an experience that was even better than the original! You can find our Padlet on Willow and Yew's class pages – here, you will see the worries and concerns from children at Birchwood and Lanchester, and you can also contribute yourself.

Many Zoom calls and some technical training later, we begun to use the fears and worries which were on Padlet to create and write a scene based on a potential high school experience – getting lost on our way to lessons, dealing with bullying, managing homework and making friends – to name but a few! After we decided how these could be resolved, we finalised our script and then recorded our scene.

Now Press Play then collected all of the scenes which were created by children at Birchwood and Lanchester, and turned them into a real Now Press Play experience!

This has been an incredible project whereby children have thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to share experiences, worries, concerns and resolutions with others — realising that they are able to support each other in offering advice and guidance, while preparing them mentally and emotionally for the next stage in their education.


