Catch Up Plan

Children across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of COVID-19. Across the country the impact of lost time in education will be substantial, and the scale of our response as a school, must match the scale of the challenge.

On 20th March the decision was made to close all schools, other than supporting children of key workers. Our approach was to do all we could to limit the impact of time out of school. Birchwood remained open throughout the lockdown period, even providing support for key worker's children during the Easter holidays and summer half term. We were also able to support children with learning at home from day one and made regular wellbeing calls home to all our families to offer our support.

From 1st June we were able to open up our school to our Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 cohorts. We were really pleased with the large uptake of families, who despite their concerns, took the opportunity to send their children back to Birchwood. For the last 4 weeks of the term we were also able to offer each of our children in Years 2, 3, 4 and 5 the chance to spend a week back in school with their friends and teaching staff, before the start of the summer holidays.

Despite all the efforts of staff at Birchwood and the fantastic support that our parents provided their children with home learning, we know that children will have missed out on their full educational entitlement last academic year. To support schools with their catch up plans the government announced a one-off universal £650 million catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all children make up for lost teaching time.

At the heart of our catch up plan is the professional knowledge and expertise of our teaching staff in school. We were determined to return to normal educational routines as quickly as possible in September. Although we are currently working under Covid 19 restrictions which hinder some areas of Teaching and Learning, we know that quality first teaching has the biggest impact on our children's progress and attainment. From September we increased our teaching assistant provision across school, particularly in Reception and Year 1, to support children's early development. We have altered timetables and increased provision and time for the teaching of phonics, reading and key maths skills this term. We have started booster groups in the morning to support our Year 6 children in preparation for their SATs and we have this week begun our after school tuition programmes for identified children in Years 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. We have also purchased several learning resources including 'Reading Plus' and 'Pen Pals Handwriting' to enhance and support our curriculum offer.

Our aim is to support all of our children to 'catch up' on any learning missed. We approach 'catch up' as a long term strategy of intervention which will be reviewed and monitored regularly over the next few years. Unfortunately, there are no 'quick fixes' when it comes to education. We will continue to focus on what we do best and use any additional funding to offer more quality first teaching.

We now have a 10 minute window for children to arrive: Reception, Year 1, Year 2 - 8.30am-8.40am

Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6 – 8.40am- 8.50am

At the start of the day teachers take registers, explain to the children what they will be doing for the day and all sorts of other important instructions about what will be happening around school.

Self Isolation Guidance

What does self isolation mean?

If you believe you have been exposed to Coronavirus, national guidance dictate that you must self isolate to prevent onward transmission to others.

If you are self isolating, you must not leave your home:

- * Do not got to work, school or public places work from home if you can.
- Do not go on public transport or use taxi's.
- * Do not go out to get food or medicine order online or by phone, or ask someone to bring it to your home.
- * Do not have visitors in your home, including family and friends, except for people providing essential care.

If anyone does develop symptoms, which includes a new continuous cough, high temperature or loss or change to your sense of taste or smell, the family should self isolate straight away and book a test.



Could we please ask you to keep school updated and inform us of any test results as soon as possible. Thank you.
