Lanchester EP visit Birchwood

Lanchester EP Primary School is very similar to Birchwood in lots of ways, but also very different. It is a good school with outstanding features and serves the community of Lanchester village, of which it is centrally located. Lanchester EP is a Church of England school with a strong Christian ethos. It has a strong link with All Saints Parish, a beautiful medieval parish church that was founded in 1147.

On Thursday and Friday we welcomed all 49 Year 6 pupils and 6 members of staff from Lanchester EP Primary School to Birchwood. In June all of our Year 5 pupils went up to Newcastle to visit our Partner School - Lanchester EP for the very first time and this week it was our turn to play host. This was the next part of the process in establishing and maintaining our very exciting and purposeful link with another Primary School in a contrasting locality.

On their way down to Birchwood the children and staff of Lanchester stopped off at Warwick Castle. This medieval castle, originally built by William the Conqueror in 1068, has been voted as one of the best castles in the world. 4 of our Year 6 House Captains and School Councillors, went to meet Lanchester pupils and spend the day with them exploring the castle and watching the live events.

After a fantastic day out, Lanchester made their way down to Birchwood Primary School. After a tour of our school, the children got to enjoy playing some sporting activities, had pizza for tea and a film night, before the staff and children all got their heads down for a cosy night's sleep in one of our school halls!

In the morning Lanchester were treated to a breakfast in school organised by Mrs Day before joining our Year 6 children in an early morning P.E lesson, an Art lesson based on Warwick Castle and an English lesson based on Cadbury World, which were led by our brilliant Year 6 staff.

Lanchester's trip down to the Midlands was topped off with a wonderful visit to Cadbury World. Again they were joined by the rest of our Year 6 House Captains and School Councillors, where we spent the day learning how confectionery is made, the history of Cadbury, the origins of chocolate and had an opportunity to sample one or two of our favourite treats.

The children from both schools had a brilliant two days, which was thoroughly enjoyed by all. All the children were fantastically behaved and were a real credit to both schools. Our partnership with Lanchester EP Primary is going from strength to strength and I am really looking forward to continuing our partnership with a joint trip down to the Bett Show in London with our Digital Leaders in January and then for all of our Year 5 pupils to visit Lanchester school up in Newcastle in June.

Spotlight on the importance of being on time



The start of the school day is an important time for children, not only do they get the chance to say hello to their friends, a key social experience, but it is also a vital time for them to get into the routine of organising themselves ready for the day. (Putting away their belongings, getting themselves started on the exciting activities planned that their teachers have set for them at a calm pace). Coming in late means a rushed start and can lead to a more difficult start to the day for children, including missed learning opportunities. Teachers often give out vital information and instructions during registration, so even missing just a few minutes can really impact on children's understanding of the day.

Sometimes children find the transition from home to school challenging, in these circumstances, try talking to them about their worries, but always focus on the positive, encouraging them to come in with a smile and minimise the time you spend 'handing over' at the gate or door. In the vast majority of cases, children are absolutely fine 10 seconds after you have left, and we will always call you if needed.

School Attendance

It sounds obvious but children are more likely to succeed when they attend school consistently. It is not just about the lessons that are missed, children also find it difficult to engage in the lessons when they return because they have missed the important teaching points when they were off, to allow them to successfully access the next stage of learning.

Good attendance at school is vital for pupils to achieve their full educational potential. Pupils with good attendance records benefit in the following ways:-

Continuity of learning which makes progress and retention easier Improved performance in coursework tasks Enhanced performance in examinations Continuity of relationships and friendships Good references for further education or employment

Good habits are formed for later life

Then there is the law! Children by law must attend school and all schools are required to record details of pupils' attendance and absence at school. We do so at the beginning of morning and afternoon sessions and within strict time limits. We are also required to report poor attendance.

We encourage children to be on time and attend by giving children lots of praise when they are 'being brave for carrying on' with minor ailments like a cold. We reward 'never lates' and 'good attendance' by giving children certificates on a termly basis, which the children are very proud of. We do however understand that children are sometimes unwell and certainly don't wish children to come into school unwell just to achieve an attendance reward, and for this reason we include children whose attendance is also slightly below 100%. Our schools always achieve better rates of attendance than schools nationally. Our children love coming to school and hate missing anything. The Government has recently set an attendance target of 95% for all schools. We are delighted that our school attendance rate is significantly above this at 97.5%.

Reminder - Absence Notification

Parents are reminded that a telephone call to school is required for absence <u>BY 8.30am</u> letting us know the child's name, class and reason for absence. A call is then required for EACH day of absence thereafter.

Can we please remind parents that on the child's return to school we still require a signed letter confirming the reason to enable us to authorise the absence.

Failure to adhere to the above policy may result in an 'unauthorised absence' being recorded on official school register.
