5.	Create a collage of your favourite African animal. What different materials can you use? (Art and Design)		
6.	Make a sandwich. Write sentences or draw pictures to explain what you did. (Literacy)		
7.	Create and record you completing an African dance. (PE/Music)		
8.	Discuss ways to stay healthy. Create a poster to share your ideas (PSHE)		
9.	Go on a walk to a place you know well. Can you draw a map for somebody else to follow? (Geography)		
10.	Explore all of the different ways to make 10. How can you show these? (Maths)		
11.	Research some similarities and differences between the UK and another Africa (Geography)		
12.	Go on a shape hunt around your house. Can you see any 2d or 3d shapes? (Maths)		
13.	Make a cardboard tube minibeast (Art and Design)		
14.	Write a set of instructions to tell your grown up how to get ready for bed (Literacy)		
15.	Make a mini wormery (Science)		
16.	Write a list of facts about yourself. Try and make them as interesting as possible (Literacy)		
17.	Plant a seed and watch it grow. What do you notice? (Science)

You need to complete 2 choices each half term (4 in total before the end of the Academic Year).
