

Trips and Visits

To support our aim to provide all our children with 'Rich Opportunities and Memorable Experiences' we have been very busy organising school trips for each year group for next half term. Our whole school curriculum is based on knowing more and remembering more. We like to provide a context to children's learning, and trips and visits help provide practical and hands on experiences that support us in bringing our curriculum to life. No matter how old you are, everyone remembers their school trips!

Over the last 15 months all of our children have missed out on their usual entitlement of a trip or educational visit each term. During this period our Year 6 children have missed out on lots of experiences that Birchwood children always look forward to. Some of these include: our trip up north to spend a few days in County Durham with our partner school – Lanchester EP Primary, an opportunity to visit Packington Farm or attending the Bett Show in London, and most importantly our residential trip to Manor Adventure.

Like all of us, our children have also missed out on many experiences outside of school like day trips, weekends away or family holidays. To try and make up for lost time, our teaching and office staff have been arranging and organising trips for next half term. As you can imagine, visitor centres and attractions have been booking up quickly since restrictions have started to lift and coach firms have also been inundated by a huge increase in demand. But due to having brilliant, proactive and determined staff, we have managed to arrange a school trip for each of our year groups for next half term. School trips:

Reception – Broomey Croft Children's Farm, Kingsbury

Year 3 - Botanical Gardens and Glasshouses, Birmingham

Year 4 - Thinktank Science Museum, Birmingham

Year 5 – Drayton Manor Park – Tamworth

Year 6 - Beaudesert Outdoor Activity Centre, Rugeley

We are all really looking forward to bringing school trips back into our curriculum and can not wait to tell you all about them and share with you some photograph pages of what we get up too. I might even try and squeeze some time into my diary to join the children on one or two of the visits!

Spotlight this week is on...

Road Safety

As a school which is situated on a very busy road, we are always keen to remind children about keeping themselves safe around roads and traffic. Our Junior Road Safety officers in school work alongside staff to give out key messages to children in both class and assembly situations.

It is really important that children of all ages are aware of the dangers of traffic, and are reminded to walk safely on pavements whenever possible. As adults we often take for granted that we are aware of looking out for cars approaching or emerging from drives and side roads, but making it clear to children that we need to keep an eye out around us for any traffic is an important skill.

The key message of how to cross the road safely, by choosing a safe place to cross and following 'Stop, Look and Listen' is especially important in our local area. Parents can all help in this by considering pedestrians and our local neighbours when parking their cars, and making sure that they do not park on any zig zag markings which are there to ensure the safety of all children around the school entrance.

As lockdown restrictions ease, the amount of traffic on the roads is increasing again, so please take this opportunity to share these important road safety messages with your children to keep everyone safe on and around our roads.
