Safer Internet Day 2019

Safer Internet Day is **celebrated globally** in February each year to promote the safe and positive use of digital technology for children and young people and inspire a national conversation. Coordinated in the UK by the **UK Safer Internet Centre**, the celebration sees hundreds of organisations get involved to help promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for children and young people.

At Birchwood we do not just think about staying safe on the internet on just one day. We complete regular learning and have lots of discussions and reminders to ensure that our children know how to stay safe online. But taking part in safer internet day offers us the opportunity to highlight positive uses of technology and to explore the role we all play in helping to create a better and safer online community.

This year we began our work in support of Safer Internet Day on Friday 1st February. We held a community event at Birchwood and were joined by 5 of our Community Academies Trust Primary Schools and another 8 local Primary Schools. Each of the 13 schools brought with them 4 of their digital leaders and a member of staff who leads on computing. We had organised for our friends from 'Now Press Play' and 'Animate 2 Educate' to deliver an action packed workshop to support key messages around online safety and online bullying.

During the morning all children and staff took part in two interactive and immersive Now Press Play sessions. Using wireless headphones the immersive audio resource engages children through emotion, imagination and movement as they become the main character in a story, meeting people, discovering places and solving problems on an educational adventure. In between each of the workshops Mr Bailey, from Animate 2 Educate, delivered a thought provoking session on how to behave online and reiterated our one word school rule and asked children to be considerate in the digital world as well as the real world.

The morning event was a fantastic way to bring children and staff together from lots of local schools to share the important messages of online safety in an enjoyable and memorable way. It was great to see all the staff and children in their different coloured uniforms interacting with each other and getting on so well. At Birchwood our aim is to continue to deliver excellent learning opportunities for our children, but also to have a positive impact on children from outside our own school. Hopefully all the children involved in the experience had very positive messages to take back to their own schools, to continue their learning about the safe and positive way of using digital technology.

Holidays during Term Time Ensuring children do not miss out

In September 2013 there were significant changes to the law with regards to holidays being taken during term time. In effect Headteachers were no longer permitted to grant an 'authorised holiday' in term time unless under 'exceptional circumstances' and following completion of a 'Leave of Absence Application form'.

'Exceptional circumstances' are considered to be only those which are 'rare and serious issues' and not because of parents 'work commitments' or the availability of 'cheap holidays'.

Our parents are incredibly supportive and it is now very rare indeed for any of them to request holidays during the school term. Parents understand the impact of children being away from school even for a short time and the impact on their child missing carefully planned programmes of work.

We occasionally hear 'my child will catch up'. Unfortunately, this is wrong. We do not have the opportunity to reteach planned lessons and our clear evidence is that missing school causes problems which ripple through a child's education career. Our policy, which matches the law exactly, is repeated regularly in our newsletters. The school does NOT approve of any holidays being taken during the term time. The simple reason for this is that we wish the best for the children and understand with complete certainty that missing school impacts significantly on progress.

There is a common myth that' I will not be caught'. The large fines levied at those deciding to ignore the rules would suggest otherwise! Unfortunately, a child returning tanned, talking about the wonderful time they have had, as well as the ability of the schools 'attendance software' to recognise unusual attendance patterns, often results in an unwelcome letter from the Local Authority 'Enforcement Service' and a 'fixed penalty notice'. Last year the local authority introduced an initiative which allows them to take 'retrospective action' when it comes to light that absences have been for holidays. This has unfortunately resulted in action against a very small minority who have been less than honest about school absence.

The local authority state: '*there are 180 days a year when children are NOT at school'. Holidays for children shoul*d be taken during the school holidays.
