School Attendance

I am very proud of the excellent attendance record our pupils at Birchwood have. Our pupils love coming to school to learn and I often hear of children who hate having to miss a day through illness. Many of our children come to school even if they are not feeling 100%. As a result we have made a really good start to this academic year and our average attendance across school is 98%. This is fantastic!

This sounds obvious but children are far more likely to succeed when they attend school consistently. It is not just about the learning that is missed when children are absent from school. We also know that children find it very difficult to engage in lessons when they immediately return back to school. It is a bit like missing an episode of a T.V programme in the middle of a series. Nowadays we get the chance to watch on 'catch up' so we don't miss anything and we know what is going on in the next episode. For children who miss a day in school, it is almost impossible to 'catch up' on the 5 lessons missed before being taught their new learning for the day.

Good attendance at school is vital for children to achieve their full educational potential. Children with excellent attendance records benefit in the following ways:-

Continuity of learning which makes progress and retention easier Enhanced performance in lessons and examinations Continuity of relationships and friendships with adults and peers Good habits that are formed for later life

Children by law must attend school and all schools are required to record details of pupils' attendance and absence at school. We do so at the beginning of each morning and afternoon session and within strict time limits. We are also required to report on poor attendance. Our focus is however very much on reward. We encourage children to be on time and attend by giving children lots of praise when they are 'being brave for carrying on' with minor ailments like a cold. We reward 'never lates' and 'good attendance' by giving children certificates on a termly basis, which the children are very proud of. We do however understand that children are sometimes unwell and certainly do not wish children to come into school unwell just to achieve an attendance reward, and for this reason we also include children whose attendance is also very slightly below 100%. We also award our attendance trophy to the class in each celebration hall who have the highest attendance that week. The children are always very pleased to show off their trophy in their classroom.

I am also very proud of all the wonderful staff at Birchwood. Their attendance rates are brilliant and it is very rare for our staff to have a day off school. On many occasions I have had to tell staff that they 'need to go home' when they have been unwell. They know how important consistency is and want the very best for all the children at Birchwood. They all work extremely hard and are very tired by the end of the week. Even when they are not feeling 100% themselves, they still manage to smile when in school.

Why attendance matters:

- Less than 5 days absence = 98%+ attendance
- 14 days absence (approx.) = 93.5% attendance
- 20 days absence (approx.) = 90% attendance
- More than 30 days absence = 88% attendance

Keeping our children safe



As promoted by Warwickshire Safeguarding Children Board's Taking Care Scheme, please do not teach blanket 'stranger danger' messages to children. The reason for this is that sometimes a stranger is the only person who can help us and is a far safer option than not talking to anyone. e.g. a child lost in a shop is far safer to tell a stranger they are lost than to wander off looking for the person they have separated from. We may choose to discuss the likely 'safest' strangers in such scenarios such as a mother with a pram or small children or someone who works in the shop.

However, we do need to clarify the stranger issue as plainly there are situations we may want to warn children about for their own safety ...

- not to get in a car with <u>anyone</u> (NOT just someone they don't know) unless their parent/guardian knows who / where / when etc and has given permission.
- not leaving school with someone other than who they were expecting unless their parent/guardian knows who / where / when etc and has given permission and they have checked with a school staff member.
- not to walk off with <u>anyone</u> (NOT just someone they don't know) unless their parent/guardian knows who / where / when etc and has given permission.
- If someone tries to grab them it is ok to break all the rules of politeness to others e.g. scream, kick, punch, bite...etc.
 Whatever they need to do to draw attention to themselves and alert others to the fact they are in danger.

Please reinforce these safety messages to your children regularly <u>without</u> giving them the idea that ALL strangers are 'bad'.
