Musical Opportunities at Birchwood

In the last couple of years, we have made huge strides in the music provision we are able to offer in school and I can now confidently say that music is a strength of our school curriculum, but it has not always been this way.

To be able to offer the quality of the curriculum we wanted to, it was important that we reviewed our staffing and subject specialism across school. Ensuring we had the expertise to lead and support the delivery of **ALL** subjects, would improve the quality of education for our children.

Music was an area we identified for improvement in school. We were offering lots of additional music experiences such as our choir, Playtastic Orchestra and peripatetic music instrument lessons, but the quality of our general music curriculum and lessons in school was not good enough.

As Primary school teachers, we are responsible for the delivery of all subjects within the framework of the national curriculum, with particular emphasis on the core subjects of literacy, numeracy and science. It is often said that Primary School teachers are 'Jack of all trades and master of none'. I look at this as a really positive way to describe the staff at Birchwood and the approach that we take to the curriculum we are able to offer. Our staff are great at many skills, have really good and broad subject knowledge and are always keen to expand their skill set and knowledge of all subjects and topics we cover.

But, as with music, having specialists in school really does support our curriculum offer. In the last few years we have secured other specialists to work at Birchwood to support P.E, games and dance and this has been very successful. Last year we approached Miss Slater, a teacher from Warwick County Music, to not only support additional music provision in school, but to lead our music curriculum lessons across all year groups.

We are reaching the end of our first term of the delivery of our new music curriculum and we are very pleased with how it has gone. Miss Slater will be working with each year group for two half terms each academic year, delivering a curriculum which progressively builds on the knowledge and skills children learn. As well as children enjoying their music learning, our teachers are also improving their own music subject knowledge.

We are fortunate to have a staff team with a fantastic wide range of skills and interests. With the continued support of subject specialists across school, we aim to deliver a full, exciting and comprehensive curriculum to all our children at Birchwood.



Keeping Everyone Safe at Collection Times



We ask that, wherever possible, only one adult drops off and collects children from school, to minimise any congestion around our one way system. We encourage you to wear a face covering when on site and we also ask that, when on site, you maintain a 2m social distance at all times. This includes any time you have to wait for your child by their classroom doors.

If you do have to bring younger siblings, or indeed when you have collected them from pre school or classes lower down the school, please make sure they walk alongside you and stay close to you if you have to wait for a short while for any brothers or sisters. We do encourage you to collect at your latest collection window to avoid waiting, and are happy to keep younger children for longer to avoid you having to wait.



Birchwood Best Practice Sporting Competitions

Covid Related Absences

Procedures if your child is absent from school due to anything Covid related:

If your child is absent due to a Covid related situation, please phone the school between 8.00am and 4.30pm. Also email the dedicated parent email address birchwoodparents@welearn365.com as soon as possible, at any time, so the appropriate measures can be put in place.

Someone from the school office will call you back, in either instance, to obtain more details surrounding the Covid case and we will then provide you with details of home learning, if the child is well enough to do it. We will also confirm your child's return date.

If you receive a negative test result, either for your child or another contact, please email the above email address to confirm the negative result, before sending your child into school.

An absence note should be provided with an explanation for a child's absence, including dates of absence and class name, by email (wherever possible) from a parent or guardian and this should be sent into school on the **first day** of your child's return. This keeps the school records accurate and up to date.

PLEASE NOTE: We ask that parents still inform school of any results of Covid tests over the Christmas Holiday period via email. The school can then determine if this affects any classes or staff, and can confirm when your child can return to school.

WARWICKSHIRE LOCAL WELFARE SCHEME

The Warwickshire Local Welfare Scheme continues to support children and families who rely on free school meals.

The Warwickshire Local Welfare Scheme has already provided over £450,000 of support to families through the Covid period, and will continue to support our most vulnerable residents.

It is through this Scheme that children who rely on free school meals will continue to receive financial support through the school holidays. It is recognised within the scheme that some families who are struggling financially, and are eligible for free school meals, have difficulty covering the period when their children are at home during the school holidays. This scheme will help those most in need by supporting eligible families with the cost of food for their children over the school holiday periods.

It will benefit those children eligible for free school meals as well as their younger non-school age siblings aged 2 or above. This support will be available over the school holidays. The only eligibility criterion for this offer is that parents are registered for free school meals.
