Holidays during Term Time

The word 'holiday' for many of us must seem like a distant memory. One of the things I know that a lot of people are looking forward to doing, when restrictions allow, is spending some quality time with friends and family, and I know holidays are an important part of this. For us in school, one advantage of people not being able to go on holiday, is that for over a year we have not received a single request for leave of absence during school time. As restrictions across the country lift, I thought that this would be a timely reminder to share our school policy on holidays during term time.

Being in school every day is key to children making good progress. Children who have excellent attendance records get the maximum opportunity to take part in all the wonderful learning experiences we provide for them. They benefit from receiving a full curriculum entitlement, building their knowledge across all subjects and refining their skills in a wider context. Over the past 15 months, our children have missed out on far too much time in school and I am really keen to make sure that they make the most of each day they are able to attend.

Birchwood do NOT support holidays being taken in term time. As a school we want the best for all our children, if our children are not in school, then we can not teach them. Missing time in school is disruptive for children and staff. Our children experience individualised programmes of work each and every day, making it very difficult to reteach work missed, which has a significant impact on children's progress. It is a myth that 'my child will catch up' and/or 'it does not matter in primary schools'.

The Headteacher may only grant leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. Examples of exceptional circumstances where leave may be granted during term time are as follows:

- If a parent is service personnel and is returning from a tour of duty abroad where it is evidenced the individual will not be in receipt of any leave in the near future that coincides with school holidays.
- Where an absence from school is recommended by a health professional as part of a parent or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue. Evidence of this would need to be provided by the G.P or consultant.
- The death or terminal illness of a close relative and the circumstances are exceptional.

- Out of school programmes such as music, the arts or sport, operating at a high standard of achievement. Documentary evidence of this event will be required.
- Religious observance The Education Act 1996 S444(3) © states 'on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which his/her parent belongs'.
- To attend a wedding or funeral of a close relative if the Headteacher is satisfied that the circumstances are truly exceptional.

Examples of circumstances NOT considered as exceptional

- Holidays taken in term time due to previously cancelled dates.
- Holidays taken in term time due to lower cost/ parental work commitments.
- Holidays abroad for the purpose of visiting a sick relative.
- Holidays booked by other family members or friends during term time.



Knowing your children

At Birchwood we get to know your children before September begins!

We hold school visits to children joining us in Reception, enabling us



We also prepare for the year with "getting to know you" activities, which the children then share with the class.

All of these help us to forge strong and positive child - teacher/teaching assistant relationships, which we continue to build on throughout the year.

We also have an induction process for children who join us during the year. At the end of the first week we contact parents to check that their child is happy and settling in, and to answer any questions or concerns that they may have. This helps to reassure parents and to form positive relationships with them. Children are given a 'shadow'; another child to help them settle in for the first few weeks, along with an induction programme to introduce them to Birchwood!
