Maintaining the Highest standards in School					
All of the schools who are part of the Community Academies Trust, are subject to an annual review of standards. These internal reviews are known as 'Peer Reviews' and are conducted by teams of staff from across our 16 schools. On Tuesday, a team of five staff, led by Mr May, came to spend the day at Birchwood to observe our brilliant practice and to talk with staff and children. In the morning the Peer Review Team conducted learning walks across school, visiting lessons, talking to children about their learning and observing standards in classes. In the afternoon, the Team interviewed the Senior Leadership Team and spoke to our Teaching Assistants and School Council. They also reviewed learning and progress in a large range of children's books and learning journals.					
Feedback was shared with the Senior Leadership Team at the end of the day and a full written report will be sent into school later in the term. <ul> <li>High expectation books</li> <li>Positive, support</li> </ul>			The online world is brilliant but as recent events such as the Momo videos have shown, it is vitally important for everyone to know how to stay safe in the online world just as much as their everyday lives. Online safety is as important as staying safe around roads, or safety in the home. In school, both our taught computing curriculum and our work with our digital leaders and our assemblies for example, teach and constantly reinforce a key simple rule. That if children see anything online that makes them get their early warning signs that 'uh oh' feeling; then they need to stop and tell a trusted adult straight away. As adults, children can often seem to be a step ahead of you in their digital skills. It is important to take an interest in what they are getting up to online, and set boundaries, not only about time spent online but also about digital content. Making sure you set parental controls on search engines, You Tube and the apps they use for example, is an easy way to support their safety online.

#### <u>Uniform Orders</u>

#### Q When can I order uniform?

- A Anytime !! Simply log onto our Birchwood Primary School website at www.birchwoodprimaryschool.com and click on the "Parents" tab, then click "ParentPay" and finally click onto "Parentpay Uniform Shop"
- Q When will my uniform be ready for collection?
- A You will receive a text message when your uniform is ready to collect. Our uniform shop is open each Tuesday from 3.05pm until 3.30pm for collections.
- Q Can I collect at any other time?
- A If you are unable to collect on a Tuesday, between 3.05pm and 3.30pm, please contact our office and we will do our best to make alternative arrangements.
- Q Can my child bring a uniform order home?
- A We prefer to avoid this option, as uniform can easily be lost this way. We would not be able to replace any orders that are lost.
- Q Is home delivery available?
- A Unfortunately we do not have this option available. Orders are only available to collect.

#### School Crossing Patrol Vacancy

A vacancy has arisen for a School Crossing Patrol Operative outside of Birchwood School. Times are to be confirmed, but the position will require morning and afternoon cover, at the busiest times of

the school day. Usually shifts are around 30 minutes each. The position is for Monday to Friday term time only (38 weeks per year spread across 12 monthly payments.) Pay for this position is £8.61 per hour plus holiday enhancements. A uniform and full training will be provided.

#### Illnesses and Absences

We certainly do not want children to come in unwell, but in reality children often do not need to stay off for 48 hours if they are sick. Children can be ill for all sorts of reasons and often not because of a bug. We recommend that children do not return to school until **24 hours** after the last episode of sickness, unless it has been diagnosed as "Norovirus" in which case we recommend that children stay off for 48 hours.

#### Procedures if your child is absent from school:

1. <u>Telephone</u> – PLEASE report absences by 8.30am on the day of absence by telephoning the school office leaving a message on the answerphone if necessary, giving the date, your child's class and reason for absence.

A telephone call is required **<u>each</u>** day of your child's absence. If we do not hear from you we need to PROTECT CHILDREN by calling parents to make sure that a child has not left home and then not appeared in school.

2. <u>Absence Note</u> - A note should be provided with a written explanation for a child's absence, which is signed and dated and should be sent into school on the **first day** of your child's return.
