Communicating and Celebrating our Achievements

Birchwood is a very busy and vibrant school, just as we like it, with lots of interesting and exciting things going on. Ensuring we keep everyone informed and up to date with 'All Things Birchwood', is a constant challenge, but a challenge that we rise to. To support us with this we have devised many methods of communicating with stakeholders and use these in different ways, depending upon what information we are trying to share and whom we are sharing it with.

Face to face communication with parents and children is very important to us. All of our staff try to make themselves as available as possible to talk to parents. As I am sure you can appreciate, this is more difficult to do during school hours, but we always encourage parents to arrange meetings with staff if they need to speak with them, or to leave a telephone message, so that staff can ring them back after school has finished. We also encourage regular communication between home and school via 'Me to You', school letters, school text messages, reading diaries, and medical forms.

Throughout the year we timetable regular opportunities to report to parents regarding progress children are making in school. We send out interim reports in the Autumn and Spring terms and follow these up with Parents Evening appointments. We also write a full end of year report and invite parents into school for a 'Show and Share' event, to celebrate children's learning and all that they have achieved. Over the last couple of weeks we have sent out this term's reports and held our first parent's evening of this school year. We were overwhelmed by the positive comments and thanks from parents. These are always very much appreciated and well received.

Our school newsletter 'The Birchwood Bugle' is sent home weekly to all parents in the form of a paper copy, but is also available digitally, on our school website. This provides up to date information about school and events that are running, as well as showcasing some of the excellent work completed in school. To support our newsletter, each year group also sends out regular tweets using our twitter page, sharing some of our 'Rich Opportunities and Memorable Experiences'. We also regularly feature in the Tamworth Herald.

We are constantly looking for new ways to share information with stakeholders. We have also produced a new 'Parent Handbook' for new parents and their children who start in Reception, or for any children who join us mid-year from another school. This contains lots of information about our school and all the new starter forms we require from parents. Each year we also send home our Parent Information Directory. This provides parents with information about your child's year in school and the curriculum themes they will be following. These documents are also available on our school website.

We will continue to do our best to communicate effectively with all stakeholders at school and to share all the exciting things that we get up to at Birchwood. We are proud of our school and all that our children achieve.

The importance of handwashing

This week we have been reminding children in school about the importance of hand washing and how to keep their hands clean. At this time of year, especially with colds, coughs and Norovirus so prevalent, it is important for everyone to remember to wash their hands well, particularly when we are about to eat or if we have had a sneezing or coughing episode.

On Monday, we shared these important messages with children in assembly, as well as reminding and modelling to them that washing your hands is far more than a quick rinse under a cold tap! To support this vital message, all our toilets in school have also had new handwashing posters to remind all our children to wash their hands after visiting the toilet.

With these simple ongoing reminders, both at home and school, we hope that the incidence of illnesses such as colds, flu, worms and Norovirus can be reduced in school, meaning that children will remain healthy and well throughout this time of year and beyond.

Parking

Hand Washing.

Good hand washing hygiene is essential in school to help stop nasty bugs spreading amongst the pupils and staff.

Washing your hands properly should take about as long as singing "Happy Birthday" twice (around 20 seconds). Use the following steps from the World Health Organization while you hum:

1.Wet your hands with water (warm or cold).

2. Apply enough soap to cover all over your hands. You can use alcohol-based handrub if you do not have immediate access to soap and water.

3. Rub hands palm to palm.

4. Rub the back of your left hand with your right palm with interlaced fingers. Repeat with the other hand.

5. Rub your palms together with fingers interlaced.

6. Rub the backs of your fingers against your palms with fingers interlocked.

7. Clasp your left thumb with your right hand and rub in rotation. Repeat with your left hand and right thumb.

8. Rub the tips of your fingers in the other palm in a circular motion, going backwards and forwards. Repeat with the other hand.
