Record High for end of year achievements at Birchwood

We are approaching the end of another fantastic year at Birchwood. As well as beginning to look forward to our summer and making plans for our return to school in September, it is a good time to look back at all that we have achieved in school.

Our 'Show and Share' evening on Thursday was a huge success. We were really pleased with the vast numbers of parents, grandparents and children who took the opportunity to come back into school to celebrate all the learning and progress made by our wonderful pupils during the course of the year. It was really nice to be able to share all the huge amounts of work that our pupils have completed and to discuss the progress children have made. Staff were also very pleased to receive lots of thanks and gratitude from parents and children.

This week we received our school end of year attainment data. We have had another brilliant year across the whole school and have achieved our highest results ever.

Early Years Foundation Stage

78% of pupils at Birchwood made a good level of development. This is more than ever before and is expected to be above National Average, which last year was 71%

Year 1 Phonics

97% of pupils at Birchwood passed the phonic screening check. Again this is expected to be above National Average, which last year, was **81%** of pupils nationally.

Year 2 - KS1

Reading - 80% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard and 27% are working at Greater Depth. This is higher than National average last year which was 76% expected and 25% at Greater Depth.

Writing - 71% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard and 17% are working at Greater Depth. This is higher than National average last year which was 68% expected and 16% at Greater Depth.

Maths - 76% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard and 27% are working at Greater Depth. This again is higher than National average last year which was 75% expected and 21% at Greater Depth.

Science - 81% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard. This is similar to National average last year which was 82%.

Year 6 - KS2

Reading - 81% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard and 27% are working at the Higher Standard. This is higher than National Average which was 76% at the Expected Standard.

Writing - 90% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard and 31% are working at the Higher Standard. This is higher than National Average which was 78% at the Expected Standard.

VGPS - 87% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard and 44% are working at the Higher Standard. This is higher than National Average which was 78% at the Expected Standard.

Maths - 81% of Pupils reached the Expected Standard and 31% are working at the Higher Standard. This is higher than National Average which was 75% at the Expected Standard.

The number of pupils achieving the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined was 74%. This is **10% higher** than this year's National Average of 64% of pupils reaching the Expected Standard in all 3 subjects.

I am absolutely delighted with our results across the whole school and I am really pleased for everyone involved. My thanks go out to all staff for their effort, commitment and hard work in supporting our pupils to achieve their very best. I would also like to thank our parents for the contribution they make to their children's learning, and last but not least I would really like to thank every single one of our children for their fantastic efforts this year. All we ever ask is for our pupils to do their very best and I can honestly say that I think they have all achieved that again this year.

Area Athletics Competition

On Wednesday 11th July, 40 children from years 3, 4, 5 and 6 represented Birchwood in the Area Athletics Competition. Overall there were 14 schools that entered which were split across two competitions - small schools and large schools. Within the large schools competition there were nine schools competing.

Each child took part in at least two events; the events consisted of sprint, distance, long jump, ball throw, javelin and relay. We came home with 8 first place medals in total, a special mention to the medal winners: Freddie (year 6), Mikey (year 5), the year 6 boys relay team and Harvey (year 6) who won 3 of the medals, well done! We came fourth overall which is an amazing achievement, all the children tried their very best, were exceptionally behaved and showed amazing sportsmanship. Well done! I would like to thank everyone that helped and came to support us at the event.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME **UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS**

The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the case of Platt v Isle of Wight Council which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time. The parents of children of compulsory school age are required to ensure that they attend school on a regular basis. The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

Head Teachers retain the ability to authorise leave in accordance with the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006. When considering such requests for a leave of absence, the school are obliged to act within the law. Head Teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application. If the leave is granted, head teachers are able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

It is for the Head Teacher to decide what is 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s). All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Attendance, Compliance and Enforcement Service of Warwickshire County Council.

It is important to note, Fixed Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices in the amount of £120 each, totalling £240 for both children, this is reduced to £60 per child if paid within 21 days).

Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996. Fixed Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices.
