School Committees

At Birchwood, our children take an active role in the life of our school. Now year groups are able to mix again, we have been busy re-establishing our school committees and are keen for our children to once again have a positive impact on how our

Across school, we have several different committees who each have a clear role and responsibility to play in the success of our school:

School Council - Our school council is formed of children across school and usually, has a member from each class. They are elected at the beginning of the school year by their peers and have the role of representing their class and their views. Our school council provides a meaningful way for children's views to be considered in decisions which impact them. They meet every two weeks and so far they have already chosen 'Mind' as their charity for the year. Today's 'Hats on' event, was their first fundraising activity. The next job for our council will be to decide on which endangered animal we choose to sponsor for the year. Our school council are also consulted in a number of decisions we make when introducing any change in

Eco Council – Our Eco Council's role is to raise environmental awareness and improve our school environment. They help others to follow our eco code, monitor our use of energy in school and encourage teachers and children to support our school in turning greener by following our 3 R's - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. This year, we are aiming to achieve the Eco Schools Green Flag award.

House Captains – Our large school is separated into four family houses (Blue-Morris, Red-Chaytor, Yellow-Goodere and Green-Chetwynd). All children and staff are associated with a house in school. The role of our House Captains is to organise and support house activities, including inter-house competitions. They also support and model positive behaviour and demonstrate 'Consideration and Respect' at all times. Year 6 children hold presentations to the rest of their house and are elected by the majority.

Digital Leaders - Our Digital Leaders support teachers to deliver our computing and online safety curriculum to their own class and others in school. They produce and deliver assemblies about online safety and acceptable use of equipment, devices and programs. They are also used to demonstrate how to use technology in the classroom. Later in the year, we are also planning to put together other committees including our Science Council, Art Council and Sport Leaders in school. Being part of any of the committees supports children to develop their skills in communication, negotiation and can improve confidence. We hope that lots of our children take the opportunity to be part of at least one of our committees during their time at Birchwood.



Children have already visited the library with their class, and had the opportunity to borrow a book to read for pleasure at home. There is a huge range of fiction including featured author sections, a wide and varied range of non-fiction and poetry books including anthologies so you can read poems from different poets and find the ones you like best. Each week, classes have a slot to come and change their books with their class teacher or Mrs Povey, who along with Mrs Hill, supports provision in our library. They are also helped at lunchtimes by our team of year 6 librarians.

We also encourage families to come into our library together when it is open after school on a Monday and a Friday. Children receive special stickers for coming to the library with their parents to choose new books and earn library certificates which will be presented in our Celebration Assemblies in school.

Holiday Absence

Parents please note:

Leave which is taken for the following reasons will not be authorised:

- Availability of cheaper holidays
- Availability of desired accommodation
- Poor weather experienced in school holidays
- Overlap with beginning or end of term

We greatly appreciate parental support to reduce the total amount of days lost due to holidays. We are committed to working in partnership with you to enable your child to reach their academic targets and to support their social development and for this to happen we need to keep individual attendance as high as possible and we all need to play our part.

Why attendance matters:

- Less than 5 days absence = 98% + attendance
- 14 days absence (approx.) = 93.5% attendance
- 20 days absence (approx.) =90% attendance
- More than 30 days absence = 88% attendance

Registering for School

Parents can now apply for Primary school places. The deadline for **Primary school applications** for reception places is 15th January 2022.




