As readers, we will read Neil Gaiman's 'Fortunately the Milk' and learn about an extraordinary being who is protected by two young children.

In Maths, we will learn about time and fractions.

In Art, we will be looking at the work of Andy Warhol.

In Computing, we will be producing informative digital content.

In Geography, we will be discovering why volcanoes and earthquakes occur.
