	Home Learning Choices for Summer:	\checkmark	Date:
1.	Geography: locate Kwame Alexander's birthplace on a world map and research 10 facts about this location.		
2.	Maths: create a symmetrical, geometrical pattern using squared paper and a mirror.		
3.	History: research and present information about an American civil rights activist (Martin Luther King, Rosa Parks, Muhammad Ali, etc.)		
4.	Science: create a diagram of the lifecycle of a plant which is native to the British Isles.		
5.	English: write a rap or free verse poem about an issue which you feel strongly about.		
6.	RE: create a Venn diagram which shows some of the different and similar beliefs of Christianity and Islam.		
7.	Art: research examples of Ancient Egyptian art and create your own example of this using materials of your own choice.		
8.	Computing: create your own computer animation.		
9.	History: create a timeline of the Civil Rights movement in America.		
10.	PSHE: research somebody famous who has had to overcome prejudices or discrimination.		
11.	History: create a fact file or storyboard which shows how ancient Egyptian mummies were made. You could even act this out and photograph each stage!		
12.	Science: grow a plant and document the different stages of its growth.		
13.	PE: practise shooting basketball hoops—see if you can score more than 5 hoops out of 20 shots!		
14.	Art: create a piece of artwork using only materials/ objects that can be found outside.		
15.	Design and Technology: try eating or cooking with a range of traditional Egyptian foods—Eg: Falafel, dates, flatbreads and olives. Describe their tastes and tell us what you thought!		
16.	Maths: take a walk outside and see if you can spot examples of the Fibonacci sequence in nature.		
17.	Music: listen to three pieces of music by Black American musicians from different decades, (EG: 1960s, 1980s and 1990s). Choose your favourite and explain why you liked it.		
18.	PSHE: Take a trip on a train.		
19.	Geography: research and present information about the River Nile. Present your information to your family or class, or record your presentation.		
20.	Free Choice!		

You need to complete 2 choices each half term (4 in total before Summer). Each half term one of your choices needs to be theme based (pink) and the other can be any of the curriculum tasks (blue). You need to be ready to share your learning at the stop off dates, with adults and children back in school, who will give you feedback on your learning. You can decide on the order of your 4 Home Learning choices which you are going to share back in school, but you can always complete other tasks from the list at home should you wish to.
