## Parent Consultation

This week all parents had the chance to talk to their children's class teacher about their children's progress in school via a phone call home. The vast majority of parents took the opportunity to book out a time slot this week and conversations with staff have been very positive. Teaching staff have asked me to pass on their thanks for all the kind messages of support they received this week.

Even though the National Covid 19 picture continues to improve, restrictions in school remain. At this current time we have been given no further information or guidance as to when and/or how these restrictions will be lifted.

Although we have not been able to have parents in school face to face, we have looked to find alternative ways to keep lines of communication open between home and school. Our dedicated parents email address has provided a platform for parents to share letters and notes for consideration. We have also started to email more of our letters home to parents and are using online forms to take bookings and gather information. Our school website, learning platform and Twitter feed have also been used more effectively to share news and keep parents updated. We believe that using a combination of technology and some of our tried and tested methods such as our 'Me to You', Reading Diaries and School Newsletter, together have enabled information and communications to be shared effectively

It is however, still very frustrating not to be able to invite our parents into school to share and celebrate your children's learning with you. Over the last 15 months we have missed out on celebration assemblies, class assemblies, hands on learning sessions, Grandparents Lunch, Christmas Performances, end of year productions, music nights, sports days and tournaments and show and share evenings. We do hope that by the end of the year that the Government relax restrictions in school enabling us to invite you all back for our annual sports day, show and share evening and Year 6 Leaver's Production.



## Spotlight this week is ...



The online world is one which we probably all spend more time in now than ever before. This week in our assemblies, we have been discussing with children ways to help them stay safe online. We remind children of the SMART rules regularly in school.

 ${\bf S}-{\bf Safe}-{\bf Keep}$  your personal information safe, do not share it with anyone online.

**M**- Meet – Meeting someone you have met online can be dangerous. Always speak to a parent about this and make sure they are there with you.

**A** – Accepting. Be careful who you accept requests, emails and messages from. Make sure you know who they are from to avoid viruses and nasty messages.

 ${f R}$  – Reliable. Information on the internet is not always what it seems. Someone is not always who they say they are.

**T** - Tell a trusted adult, such as a parent, carer or teacher if something online makes you feel uncomfortable.

We would encourage parents to keep talking about these rules with children at home. Being aware of the things your children are doing online and having open conversations about them is a great way to help them stay safe.






fofofofofofofo YEAR 5 DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY


