#### Mr Coleman – Headteacher.

Has strategic responsibility and overall accountability for standards and performance in school, including H.R and finance.

#### Mrs Day – Associate Headteacher.

Deputises for the Headteacher and has responsibility for SEND provision in school, liaising with external agencies and line managing Teaching Assistants.

#### Miss Purdy – Maths Co-ordinator.

Has responsibility for standards in maths across the whole school.

#### Miss Mould - English Co-ordinator.

Has responsibility for standards in English across the whole school.

#### Mrs Willis – EYFS Leader.

Is responsible for standards in the Early Years Foundation stage.

Our SLT are part of a wider network of leaders at Birchwood who together are committed to securing the best possible outcomes for our children.

#### Mrs Jackson – Office Manager.

Organises and co-ordinates office administration and communication procedures to ensure school effectiveness, efficiency and safety.

#### Mr Jackson – Caretaker.

Responsible for the maintenance and security of our school building and grounds.

#### Mrs Haskell – Senior Mid-day Supervisor.

Ensures the security, safety, care and wellbeing of children, making dinnertimes count.

At Birchwood we have high expectations, a no-excuse culture and a single-minded focus on making our school an outstanding place of learning for all. It is the collective efforts of all our leaders that makes Birchwood so great.

## Reminder for Parents Leave of Absence during Term Time

As you will be aware, current attendance regulations stipulate a Headteacher may not grant a leave of absence during term-time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

It is for the Headteacher to decide what he/she views as 'exceptional', and it is at their discretion, if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. If the leave is granted, the Head teacher is able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for Leave of Absence can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s). Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued and not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996.

Parents are asked to respect the new regulations under which the school must work and if there is a need to take a child out of school during term-time, an application or request must be made in advance and make clear how the circumstances are exceptional.
