# **Birchwood House System**

Our House Families are a really important part of life at Birchwood. We are very proud of our reputation in our Local Community. As a very popular and full school, we currently have 436 pupils across our 14 classes. Due to our size, we are always looking for ways for our pupils to talk, socialise and share learning together. Being part of a house gives children an opportunity to work together and get to know children in other year groups and classes.

At Birchwood we have 4 Houses: Chaytor (Red), Morris (Blue), Goodere (Yellow) and Chetwynd (Green). Our house names are based on local historical families. Some of the local streets around our school are also named after these same families. All of our pupils are placed into one of the houses and we make sure that we keep families together. All of our staff at school are also connected to one of our four Houses.

On Friday 13<sup>th</sup> September, all the children gathered together in their houses to vote for their new House Captains for this academic year. Over half the children in Year 6 put themselves forward for the role. The children spent all week preparing and practising their speeches to try and convince the rest of their house mates that they are the best person for the job. # Spotlight on Excellence this week is:

.....The importance of washing your hands

Washing your hands sounds like such a simple thing to do, but it is also one of the most important things we do in our daily routine. It is also the one children forget most easily. Eager to get back to playing, learning and having fun with their friends, it is easy to forget this vital task. Yet the importance of good handwashing cannot be underestimated; there can be more than 1000 bacteria living on just 1 square centimetre of your hands. Illnesses such as diarrhoea and threadworms, amongst others, can be avoided by keeping our hands clean.

At Birchwood we remind children of the importance of washing their hands within our work in class and our assemblies as part of our PSHE as well as part of routines in school. 
