Welcoming our New Reception Children into our Birchwood Family

Our new Reception children have made a great start to their time at Birchwood. They have very quickly got into excellent routines and have had a very positive impact in school. It is lovely to see all the children so happy to be at Birchwood.

Our Early Years Foundation Stage Leader Mrs Willis and the rest of her team, Miss Lowe, Miss Johal, Mrs Spong, Mrs Tweed and Mrs Day have all been hugely impressed with the children. They have commented on their outstanding learning behaviours, their excellent listening skills, their co-operation and sharing skills and their overall positive attitudes.

Our induction process for our new Reception has had to be adapted slightly this year. Unfortunately, we were unable to hold our story time sessions in school before the summer. We also had to hold our welcome meeting for parents virtually, missing out on the opportunity to meet in person and show parents around our school and Reception classes.

Our start of year and induction arrangements have also had to change. Our 'home visits' have had to be replaced with a 'school visit'. Staff used this meeting to share key information about our school and processes. It also provided our parents an opportunity to have some quality one to one time to discuss any queries or concerns they may have had.

The children have now all spent 3 days in school learning all about our routines and how our school works. Having only half the children in at a time enables our Early Years team to really get to know the children well and gives them an opportunity to show them in detail all the fantastic learning that they will be doing. The routines that are established in the first few weeks are followed by children all the way through their time at Birchwood.

Monday will be the first full day in school with all 60 of our Reception children. It will be lovely to see them learning altogether and I am sure that they will all have a brilliant first year at Birchwood. The children and their parents will all be arriving in school in their window between 8:30am and 8:40am. Please help and support them by keeping to your own family windows. Many thanks.

Reminder for Parents Leave of Absence during Term Time

As you will be aware, current attendance regulations stipulate a Head teacher may not grant a leave of absence during term-time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

It is for the Head Teacher to decide what he/she views as 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion, if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. If the leave is granted, the Head teacher is able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Failure to make an application for Leave of Absence can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s). Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is issued and not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996.

Parents are asked to respect the new regulations under which the school must work and if there is a need to take a child out of school during term-time, an application or request must be made in advance and make clear how the circumstances are exceptional.

Birchwood Best Practice The importance of phonics

Phonics helps your child to read and spell. Phonics is using the sounds letters make to break down and read words. Without this ability your child cannot be fully literate. Words are like



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codes and phonics teaches the children how to crack the reading code.

At Birchwood we believe phonics is paramount. It is amazing how quickly the children go from not being able to read at all, to blending simple words and then sentences together. We start teaching phonics daily in Reception and build on this every year.

I find teaching phonics very rewarding. Some children find it more challenging than others but they all progress, at different rates and some in smaller steps than others. The progress they all make is amazing and we are proud of them all.

To ensure that phonics is embedded it is really important that children read regularly, both at home and at school. Please help your child by sharing books with them. - Mrs Tucker
