New Education Inspection Framework

We are very proud to be considered an 'outstanding school', recognised by OFSTED in 2014/15, but our excellent reputation in the local community means far more to us. We have several very good Primary Schools in our local area, who also have good reputations, which makes being considered the first choice for many parents even more of an achievement. At Birchwood we remain a full and very popular school.

Our whole school approach, since receiving such positive feedback from OFSTED, has always been to continue to look for improvements in our practice and to do things to the best of our ability. Recent improvements made in school include 'Home Learning', which has gone down brilliantly with children, parents and staff, BASE skills academy to support children's excellent behaviour, positive changes to lunch time arrangements and a new programme of Monitoring, Evaluation and Support to ensure the highest standards are achieved at our school. Our children are at the centre of all decisions and actions taken in school. Our children deserve the very best education and experiences and it is our job to ensure that this is what they get!

Birchwood is a much better school 5 years on from its last inspection. All of the excellent practice recognised then, has been embedded and we have developed and grown as a school since. Our staff in school are brilliant. We have managed to secure the services of all of our great Teachers and Teaching Assistants and have also made some really positive appointments across school during this period.

In September OFSTED introduced the new 'Education Inspection Framework'. The biggest change to inspections will be the focus on the real substance of education: the curriculum. Inspectors will spend less time looking at test data, and more time looking at what is taught and how it is taught. They will consider how a school has achieved their results. OFSTED want to make sure that good results come from teaching a broad, rich curriculum, that reflects real learning, not just intensive preparation for a test or to move up to the next 'stage'. Ofsted grades will reflect the areas that matter most to parents: quality of education, behaviour and attitudes, personal development, and leadership and management.

The new Education Inspection Framework now requires all areas to be judged as outstanding, for the school to receive 'outstanding' as an overall judgement. There is now also an increased focus on the quality of education, the curriculum and all foundation subjects. The latest data from OFSTED, reported

that "more than half of previously outstanding schools lost their top grade at their most recent inspection" - BBC.

So how would Birchwood fair under the new inspection framework?

Under the previous inspection framework, that used a 'best fit' judgement to summarise standards, practice at Birchwood would still have been recognised as outstanding. We have a fantastic rich, broad and balanced curriculum at Birchwood and I am confident that we would still be recognised as an outstanding school, even under the raised expectations of the new framework. I expect our school will be re-inspected within the next 2 years. In the meantime, we will continue to do all we can for the children at our school on a daily basis. I can assure all parents that we never do anything just for inspection purposes. If it does not benefit and improve standards for our children, then we do not do it in our school.

Thank you all for your continued support of our brilliant school.

Being Late for school

'It doesn't matter if my child is late for school'....

Not what the children would say! They absolutely hate being late. They arrive after all their friends are already sat down in school and enter a classroom of 30 others looking at them. At the start of the day teachers take registers, explain to the children what they will be doing for the day and all sorts of other important instructions about what will be happening around school. Apart from this, being late is NOT an authorised absence. Persistent lateness will often result in contact from Education Social Workers who inspect our registers and will prosecute for persistent cases.

Going Green at Birchwood

Our mission is to make Birchwood a much greener place! We have already started by ordering new bins from a company that will take away our food waste and turn it into bioenergy. This means that instead of our waste food from break and lunch times being taken to landfill, it will now be used to create power for the national grid.



Our school will receive regular reports on how much energy has been created with the waste and we will share this with the children in assemblies and with you on our newsletter when we

receive it.

This year we have also decided to purchase a rooted 4ft Christmas Tree, which we will have in our foyer during December, as we have done in previous years. Our plan is to then plant the tree in the school garden alongside the conference room, so that it can flourish and grow (we are informed that each year the tree should grow approximately 1ft taller.) It is safe to re-use glass

jam jars occasionally as long as the jars are properly washed. If jam jars are re-used, they should be free from chips and cracks, and should be sterilised prior to each use. Well-fitting lids will also minimise any hygiene risks to the food in the jars. The school will also make sure that all jars are sterilised before use.

The regulations on food contact materials, which may limit the re-use of jam jars, apply to businesses. These regulations are highly unlikely to apply to the use of jam jars for occasional community and charity food provision. If you have any concerns about the re-use of jam jars, contact your local authority food



Everyone has a mental health

For some, the mere mention of the word mental health conjures up negative images and many people do not believe it is a relevant term for them. At Birchwood, we are working hard to dispel the myth that mental health is irrelevant for most

With the children, we explain that our overall well-being is made up of our physical health (how well our body works) and our mental health (how we feel about ourselves and manage our emotions), and that both are equally important. To look after our physical health, we brush our teeth twice daily, eat a balanced diet, and try to get in 30 minutes of exercise a day and much more. To look after our mental health, we try to include the following 5 activities over the day: connect with people (through games, phone calls and learning), be active (physical activity that raises our heart rate), give (by helping others), learn (try new experiences and persevere to accomplish a target) and notice (taking time for quiet activities such as self-reflection, nature spotting, listening to music).

Just like with our bodies, sometimes we need to ask for help when something goes wrong. If we developed an illness such as anaemia or had an accident which resulted in a broken leg, we would go to the doctors and would let people know we needed help. The same is true for mental health. If adverse life experiences such as family break up, the loss of a loved one or other traumatic experiences occur, people need to feel able reach out for support until they are able to manage on their own again. If people are not allowed to talk about their difficult feelings and thoughts, they often end up struggling alone which can lead to the feeling of being overwhelmed. At this point, more severe problems can occur because the original problem was not dealt with. For lots of people, the opportunity to talk and ask questions will be enough to get them through these difficult times. However, sometimes additional support is required.

At Birchwood, we ensure that all staff receive relevant training and know the importance of mental health. We also continually source new training and services to support our pupils and families. Many of these contacts and the service they offer can be found on the school's website under the wellbeing tab.
