I hope this give you a little insight into my role here at Birchwood.

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

Transition

The transition into secondary school is fast approaching for year 6 pupils and The Warwickshire School Health & Wellbeing Service would like to wish all students well in their move to secondary school.

Below is a list of 12 steps which may help students prepare for their transition.

- Look at the school website and find out useful information on your new school
- Practice packing up all the things you will need to take to school, maybe pack the night before.
- Practice buying your own food and drink in a café. Find out how the canteen & pay machines at the school work.
- Plan the route you will take to your new school and do a few trial runs. Do you need to sort out a bus pass?
- Make sure you make time to eat breakfast it gives you fuel for the day.
- Make the most of the Transition Day don't be afraid to ask questions.
- Do you use a planner/diary? If not, it may be worth you getting one and practice using it.
- If you have a map of your new school, have a look and get used to using it.
- Find out about the uniform and order in plenty of time.
 Be aware of school policies on things like jewellery, piercings and mobile phones.
- Talk to friends and siblings. Who else do you know who is moving to the same school?
- Get into a good bedtime routine. Young people still need lots of sleep as your brain is constantly developing.
- Start taking responsibility for yourself by practicing getting your school bag ready, doing your homework, and getting yourself up in the morning.
