## **Brilliant Birchwood Behaviour**

At a time when many schools nationally are struggling with poor pupil behaviour, we are extremely proud that behaviour in our school is still recognised as 'Outstanding'.

Our children are tremendously proud to be a Birchwood pupil and continually demonstrate this with their exceptional behaviour when out on school trips. We always receive positive comments from staff who work at educational settings we visit and from members of the public, about our well behaved, well-mannered and enthusiastic children. We have even introduced a feedback sheet to our trip pack so we can gather all the nice things said about our school. Birchwood children always look extremely smart in their school uniform and are a fantastic advertisement for our school. School trips take a lot of organising and planning and can be quite stressful for staff, but our children make the day of the trips a real pleasure.

At Birchwood we also have lots of visitors who come into our school. Our visitors regularly make comments to staff and myself about the friendly and caring atmosphere our school has and how polite and happy our children are. I also have many conversations with staff from companies and organisations that do a lot of work in our school and with our children. Many of them tell me that Birchwood is by far their favourite school to visit and to work at. I have heard numerous times 'Don't take it for granted, believe me not all schools are like this, I wish they were!' For our staff and as Head teacher, that is a really nice and positive thing to hear and something that I am always pleased to be able to share with our children and parents.

Relationships are key to the outstanding behaviour in our school. Our staff get to know children and their families well, building relationships based on mutual respect and consideration. Our staff are positive role-models and often go above and beyond for our children. Children feel happy and safe in school, but also confident to approach any member of staff should they need help or support.

Our policy on behaviour is to focus on the positives and look to reward positive learning behaviours and manners in school. Consideration and Respect is our one school rule and in assemblies and circle time we talk regularly about what this means, looks like and feels like in our school. We also feel it is very important to put children at the forefront of their own and others behaviour and therefore we use 'Stop It Please' to support this approach.

At the end of each week if children have made good choices regarding their behaviour and not received a behaviour slip, then they earn their 'skills academy' time on a Friday afternoon. This is a great way to reward all those children who are just brilliant all the time. It is very rare that any children do not earn their skills time, but if they do miss it, then a member of staff uses that time to talk to the children about the choices they have made and what they can do to ensure that earn their skills academy next time.

Our children's excellent behaviour means that the staff get to focus their time and energy on delivering excellent teaching and ensures that our children get to spend their time learning lots!

# Spotlight on Excellence this week is ... Being Resilient...

Trying something new can be challenging, whether you are an adult or a child. Whether it is a new sport, some new learning in school or facing a fear, whatever it is we rarely succeed first time, and often not even the second or third! This ability to keep having a go, even when we fail first or even the second or third time is important. To be resilient is a skill that we all need to be successful. All too often, children give up without some gentle encouragement to have another go. So a helpful hint that maybe they can do it if they try again and even a bit of modelling that adults too don't always succeed first time and it's ok to fail and calmly persevere and try again. Children need to experience some examples of failing, but also to be supported to try again themselves, learning that they do not always need an adult to help them to succeed. It can be as simple as not always being the one who wins a game, or trying again when the tower or model they have built falls down. Being resilient, is a real life skill which helps in so many aspects of everyday living.

## **Arriving Late...**

Children absolutely hate being late for school. They arrive after all friends are already sat down in school and enter a classroom of 30 others looking at them.

At the start of the day teachers take registers, explain to the children what they will be doing for the day and all sorts of other important instructions about what will be happening around school. After 8.40am children must enter school through the office entrance to be registered separately.

Apart from disturbing your child's school routine, being late is NOT an authorised absence.

Persistent lateness will often result in contact from Education Social Workers who inspect our registers and will prosecute for persistent cases.


