Purpose

It is vital that our curriculum develops learners who are inquisitive about the world in which they live, developing a sense of their place within it through links to locality. Our school places importance of the development of knowledge through a broad and balanced curriculum which builds on children's knowledge to enable them to achieve their full potential.

Purpose
