### Spotlight on Excellence Our focus this week is: Our fantastic phonics provision



This week we were delighted to receive a letter from Nick Gibb, the Minster of State for School Standards, congratulating us on our results in the Phonics Screening check that our children, who are now our Year 2 pupils, took last June when they were in year 1. Every year, children in Year 1 nationally undertake a phonics check and we were thrilled that we had 97% of our children achieve the required standard, making Birchwood one of the top 6% of schools anywhere in the country. This is the fourth year in succession that we have been recognised for our fantastic achievements in the phonics screening check.

This does not just happen by accident, it is a result of excellent practice and hard work by teachers, TA's and children across Reception and Year 1, where children learn to read, recognise and write their sounds and are constantly being encouraged and shown how to use them correctly in their reading and writing across their lessons in school. Our children also work in smaller groups for their phonics sessions, and our teachers and TA's use Phonics Tracker to check where children are up to in their learning, meaning they are working on the exact sounds they need to learn next so they are always being challenged at just the right level.

Well done everyone, we are all really proud!

Dear Mr Coleman

I would like to congratulate you, your staff and your pupils on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2018 phonics screening check.

Achieving early fluency in decoding is a necessary first step in acquiring the key skill of reading.

There is a significant body of evidence that demonstrates that systematic phonics is the most effective method for teaching early reading. We want to ensure that every child develops a firm grasp of phonics, which is why I was delighted to see your results. With 97 per cent of pupils at Birchwood Primary School reaching or exceeding the pass mark in the check, your school is in the top 6 per cent of all primary schools in the country.

This year's figures show that 89 per cent of pupils who achieve the expected standard in the check go on to achieve at least the expected standard in key stage 1 reading teacher assessment, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation in reading, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.

Thank you for your work in this vital area of a child's early education and congratulations again to you and your staff for all you have achieved.
