The end of a school year is always a very busy time for everyone involved in school. There are many events planned in our school calendar to celebrate the end of the academic year, but at the same time we are also busy putting plans together for the start of next year.

This year has been even busier than most as many of our events have had at least a Plan A, B and sometimes C. For many weeks we were waiting on announcements regarding the lifting of Covid 19 restrictions nationally and were hoping that this would also apply to schools, enabling us to run our usual end of school events. Unfortunately, that has not been the case and we have had to look at other possibilities.

I know that for some schools they have had to make the difficult decision not to hold some of their usual events. We know how important these are for children at Birchwood and so have been keen to look for alternative ways of still being able to put these on. Unfortunately, one of the areas we have not been able to resolve is having parents in school to watch and take part in these events first hand. I know that this will be disappointing for many, but we hope to be able to share photographs and videos of the events where we can.

Sport Days will now take place in year groups on the week beginning 5th July and with reserve dates (in case of poor weather), on the week beginning 12th July. These will be held on our school field and photographs will be shared on the class pages of our school website for parents to view.

Instead of our usual 'Show and Share Evening' a collection of photographs taken of children's learning throughout the year, will be shared on class pages of our school website. Children will start to bring home their learning books for parents to view on the week beginning 12th July.

Our moving up day for children will still take place on Wednesday 7th July. Parents will be informed of their child's next year's Class, Teacher and Teaching Assistants on Friday 25th June. Unfortunately, we are unable to invite our new Reception intake and their

parents into school on that morning, but will be delivering a welcome meeting to parents virtually instead. Our Year 6 children are also not able to spend the day at The Polesworth School and instead will have a day of virtual activities.

We are still holding our Year 6 end of year production, but this year it will be held outside – weather permitting. We will hold this twice, once on Monday 12th July for Willow class parents and once on Wednesday 14th July for Yew class parents. This will be restricted to one family member ticket per child, but we will be filming 5 of the songs from the production and posting one of them each day starting on Monday 12th July, onto our school website for our children and families to watch.

Wednesday 21st July is our last day in school and will be a 1:00pm finish. A special leavers assembly, just for our Year 6 children and retiring staff, will still take place. This will enable us to say goodbye and good luck properly and will give us an opportunity to share some of our memories of our time at Birchwood.

Starting School

Some children are really ready to start 'big' school others find it more of a challenge, but soon begin to enjoy it when they see how much fun it is.

Our Early Years area is spread across two classrooms and an outdoor space and once the



children have been shown all the areas and classroom routines they can access these areas independently.

Here at Birchwood we like to ease the children into school life by sharing our story time sessions each week. These consist of coming into school accompanied by their grown up and enjoying a story and some songs. This helps the children to get to know the EYFS staff who will be teaching them. These sessions end with an hour in the classroom. You can see the children gaining in confidence each week.

We follow up the story times with a school visit a few days before they start school. We hope all our children and parents enjoy these visits and that we answer all the questions you want to ask so both grown up and child can start their school journey with us feeling happy and confident. - Mrs Tweed

Our Eco Councillors have been working very hard reminding classes about all of the things we do at Birchwood to make our School a much greener and more eco friendly environment.

We collect paper from the classrooms and recycle this with a company called Business Waste. This goes to make paper towel rolls, that you may see at fuel stations or service areas.



We recycle food waste through Re-Food. This goes to make bio energy and is sold on.



We collect clothing for Warwickshire Air Ambulance. You will see the big yellow collection bank to the right of our school drive. All donations are gratefully received. This helps to keep our air ambulance flying.



We recycle batteries through Duracell, this stops harmful chemicals going into landfill sites.



We collect spectacles, which we donate in bulk through a local optician and these go to developing countries, giving them access to improved vision through the countries own schemes.

We recycle ink toners through AOS which are refilled and re-used. We have also just registered with a company called Recycle 4 Charity, who collect the ink cartridges predominantly used in small desktop

printers and pay the school cash for them! Please feel free to send in any spent ink cartridges for our collection, we do love to raise extra funds, to spend on the children.

Our kitchen garden is all planted and growing well, thanks to the hard work of the children attending gardening club, our Office Manager and our Caretaker who take turns watering the plants.




