6.	Make a sandwich. Write sentences or draw pictures to explain what you did. (Literacy)		
7.	Plant a seed and watch it grow. What do you notice? (Science)		
8.	Discuss ways to stay healthy. Create a poster to share your ideas (PSHE)		
9.	Make a poster or fact file about your favourite minibeast (Literacy)		
10.	Write a set of instructions to tell your grown up how to get ready for bed (Literacy)		
11.	Talk with your grown up about a holiday you have been on. What was your favourite part? Where did you go? What did you do/see? (Geography)		
12.	Explore all of the different ways to make 10. How can you show these? (Maths)		
13.	Explore a map/Google Earth. What different countries can you find? Do you know anything about the different places in the world? (Geography)		
14.	Go on a shape hunt around your house. Can you see any 2d or 3d shapes? (Maths)		
15.	Create a collage of your favourite African animal. What different materials can you use? (Art and Design)		
16.	Write a list of facts about yourself. Try and make them as interesting as possible (Literacy)		
17.	Go on a walk to a place you know well. Can you draw a map for somebody else to follow? (Geography)		
18.	Talk to your grown up about the importance of staying safe in the sun. What do you have to do? (PSHE)		
19.	Research some similarities and differences between the UK and another country. (Geography)		
20.	Draw a picture to show your favourite memories from your time in Reception. (PSHE)		

You need to complete 2 choices each half term (4 in total before Summer Holidays). Each half term one of your choices needs to be theme based (pink) and the other can be any of the curriculum tasks (blue). You need to be ready to share your learning at the stop off dates, with adults and children back in school, who will give you feedback on your learning.
