Thank you to Team Birchwood for funding the purchase of these books in school.

Children in years 3 to 6 also have our fantastic 'combo competition' on Reading Plus to get involved with. Children have been set the challenge to earn combo's on Reading Plus, recording this on their own reading tree by colouring in a leaf. Combo's are earned by reading 2 texts and scoring 80% or more on the quiz for both within a 24 hour period. These combo's enable children to 'level up' unlocking new texts, as well as improving their reading, vocabulary and comprehension skills at the same time.

We will be offering rewards to children and classes who have the most combo's after the holidays, as well as undertaking activities around our winter books. So this holiday really is the time to get comfy and enjoy some time getting lost in a good book.

RQBLOX

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At Birchwood, we are committed to ensuring our pupils are kept safe online. For those of you who are unfamiliar with 'Roblox', it is a multi-player online gaming platform which allows children to play and create a variety of games in a 3D world. It has an age restriction of 13+. Recently, it has become increasingly popular, therefore we would like to offer some 'top tips' to ensure we all do our bit to keep our pupils safe:

- Unlist social media accounts: ensure your child's social media accounts are not listed in the settings/account information.
- Check shared information: check that your child is not giving away any personal information in their bio/profile.
- Restrict payment methods: ensure your debit/credit card is not associated with their account if you do not wish for your child to make additional in-game purchases.
- Disable in-game chat.

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• Tell your child to be careful and to think twice before they click any random advert or popup. There a lot of phishing scams that advertise 'free roblox' etc. with the intent of stealing your child's personal information.

Unfortunately, there are many videos on YouTube showing children how to change their age on Roblox. There are additional safety features for children under 13, for example having their posts and chats altered for inappropriate content and behaviour, so it is worth checking that your child has set up their account with the correct age. You can find this in their account settings.
