Our Arrangement for Next Year

Last week, letters were emailed out to all parents informing them which class their children will be taught in, from September. I am sure the children were all very excited to find out who would be teaching them next year.

Preparing children properly for a new school year starts months ahead and is always very important. We take a great deal of trouble to get it right. Looking ahead and preparing well every year ensures our children come back in September excited about what is ahead of them, rather than being frightened by the unknown.

As part of our planned induction we organise an exciting 'moving up day'. On our moving up day the children are registered by their current class teacher and then move to their 'new class'. During the day, we spend some time on agreeing a set of positive class rules based around 'Consideration and Respect'. We also give the children an opportunity to complete some writing about themselves and complete a short maths activity. When the children come back in September we make sure they are greeted by the work they complete which is displayed in their new classroom.

At Birchwood we also spend a great deal of time ensuring that

We ensure that the wealth of knowledge and information built up over the course of this year and previous years is passed on. This ensures that we can maximise learning potential and opportunities from day one, catering for all individual needs. As well as our children, our school staff are also looking forward to next year. At the end of every school year there are always mixed emotions. Teachers and Teaching Assistants get very attached to their class and children. They spend a great deal of time and energy planning, preparing and delivering exciting learning opportunities. Over the course of the year they share a lot of experiences together and get to know each other very closely. Staff are often sad at the thought of not teaching or seeing their old class on a daily basis, but at the same time excited at the prospect of working with and getting to know

In September we will be losing our current Year 6 cohort of children as they take their next step in their learning journey to The Polesworth School, but hopefully they will all come back to see us and keep us updated on how they are getting on. At the same time we will be welcoming a brand new cohort of children who will be starting off their learning journey in Reception with Mrs Smith, Miss Lowe and the rest of the Early Years team. September sees a lot of change, but one thing that will not change is our commitment to ensuring that Birchwood remains at its brilliant best and ensures that all our children receive 'Rich Opportunities and Memorable Experiences'.

Spotlight this week is ... Transitions for all.

This week we emailed out to parents details of the classes that all children will be moving to in September. For most children this is a very exciting time of year, and they are keen to find out all about their new teachers and teaching assistants.

Some children however can find the upcoming change a little daunting. If your child does mention worries about transition then it is helpful to talk with them at home about the things that they might have questions about. Sometimes the smallest things can be the source of the biggest worry, for example not knowing where to put their coat or water bottle. In reality of course their peg will be labelled when they arrive, and staff will show them where everything goes but pointing this out will probably help calm their fears. Reminding them of all the things that will still be the same will also be helpful, for example, the friends they will be with.

Perhaps the most important thing to reinforce with all children is that while change can sometimes be unsettling for a little while, it is also exciting and that new and interesting challenges are ahead.

Arriving Late...

Children absolutely hate being late for school. They arrive after the rest of the class are already sat down in school and enter a classroom of 30 others looking at them



At the start of the day teachers take registers, explain to the children what they will be doing for the day and all sorts of other important instructions about what will be happening around school. After their arrival window has ended, children must enter school through the office entrance to be registered separately.

Apart from disturbing your child's school routine, being late is **not** an authorised absence. Persistent lateness can result in contact from Education Social Workers who inspect our registers and will prosecute persistent cases.

Please note that although we check the suitability of Applications, they can be changed without notice. Parents should therefore check the Application BEFORE children go on to them.
